I hope all of you had a wonderful holiday season! It is good to be back and into the swing of things. I look forward to a great 2018 for Murray Lake Elementary.

Our students started taking the NWEA (Northwest Education Association) Measurement of Academic Progress (MAP) and The Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) test this week. This testing will continue for the next few weeks. The results of these tests in math, reading, and language arts let us know how your child has grown since the fall. It gives our teachers, students and parents feedback on the progress the students are making. All of our students set goals for themselves back in September, and this data will give our students feedback on how they are progressing toward their goal. Please remind your child to do his/her best on these assessments, as we want to have accurate data in which to use to make instructional decisions surrounding our teaching and learning. We will send home MAP reports to you when we wrap up all of our MAP testing later this month.

Tonight (January 12) is Elementary Night at the varsity girls' and boys' basketball games (beginning at 5:30 pm) at Lowell High School. All Murray Lake students will enter the games free of charge. There will be lots of prizes handed out as well. I hope to see lots of kids there!

Our student council is sponsoring a Blood Drive on Wednesday, February 7, 2:00-7:30 pm. Please help your child recruit people to come to our Blood Drive. Over 200 units of blood are needed each day by our local hospitals. Up to three people can be saved from one pint of donated blood. More information will be coming home today or Monday.

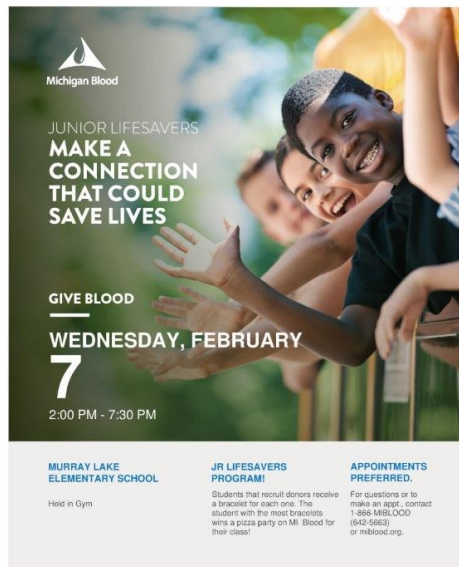
