From the Principal...

All parents will receive MAP reports this week. These reports show how your child has grown from the fall of this school year in math, reading, and English language arts (ELA). Kindergarten and first grade will only receive scores on reading and math. I've attached some informational documents to our newsletter that can also help to give you a better understanding of these MAP reports. I am VERY impressed with our scores this spring. As a school, our scores show that Murray Lake students, as a whole, are much higher academically than students across the nation and have grown significantly more than these same students. Although we do very well, we still use these MAP scores to evaluate our teaching and learning and look for areas of instruction where we can improve. If you have any questions about these scores, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I use MAP scores to determine if students qualify for advanced placement in math or for an advanced literacy cluster. Due to our ever increasing number of advanced math students, I placed all of these students in the same classroom this year. This worked out well, however, due to a few concerns that came up, we will not be running advanced math classes in the way we did this year. Next year, kids will move between grade level classrooms for math. One grade level teacher will teach advanced math, so some kids will move out of that advanced math teacher's room and some kids will move into this room during math instruction. If you have any questions about this, please do not hesitate to call me.

We had 2636 items brought in for the FROM Food Fight!!! Mrs. Cyrocki's room won the classroom competition with 672 items, with Eldridge in a close 2nd with 625 items!!! I am hopeful for an MLE victory, but the real winners will be the needy families that FROM serves on a weekly basis. Thank you all!

When Mears is not volunteering, she loves to watch her kids play all of their sports (softball, baseball, football, gymnastics, and swimming).




